Gujarat HC apprised of progress in cases against MPs/MLAs



AHMEDABAD: The Gujarat high court on Tuesday was apprised of the development in criminal proceedings against elected representatives. The lower courts in Gujarat conducted hearings in 48 cases in the last two months of 2022.

Court issued directions to fast-track all criminal cases against politicians. The apex court had ordered all courts to try and hear these cases on a day-to-day basis if possible and not to grant long adjournments. The lower courts across Gujarat listed 48 cases in November and December 2022. The report shows that four new cases were instituted in 2021 and seven new cases in 2022. With Patidar leader

Hardik Patel being elected as BJP MLA, the pending cases against him, filed between 2015 and 2017, have also been added to the list of pendency of cases against MPs and MLAs. Following the SC directions, the HC in October 2020 ordered all principal district judges to see that the criminal cases involving MPs/MLAs are expedited. There were 98 cases pending against the elected representatives - either sitting or former - and 12 cases were serious in nature in which the punishment prescribed is either 10 years or above.

For the purpose of monitoring, the HC calls for periodical reports from the district courts which give details regarding status of the cases, listing of cases for hearing, progress or adjournment, reason for adjournment, order of stay by higher courts etc.

Gujarat has second highest number of street children

AHMEDABAD: According to figures provided by the Union government, Gujarat has the second highest number of children who live on the streets.

Data provided by the Union ministry of women and child development shows that 1,990 children live on the streets in Gujarat, second only to Maharashtra, where 5,153 children live on the streets.

Those working in the field of child rights say the actual number of such children could be higher, although the number of children on the streets keeps fluctuating. Quoting figures uploaded on the Baaal Swaraj portal, the government, in reply to a question in the ongoing budget session of Parliament, said that as of March 24, 2022, the total number of street children in Gujarat stood at 1,990. Of these, 1,086 children lived with their families on the streets, 895 lived on the streets during the day but returned to their homes in slums or hutments at night. Nine children were such that

they lived all alone in the streets without parents or relatives. "The actual number of children who live on the streets could be higher than what has been provided. This number is however not constant, as the number of children who live on the streets is a transient thing," said Rajesh Bhat, convener of Child Rights Collective, Gujarat. Bhat clarified that there is a difference between "children living on the streets"

and "street children". "Those living on the streets go back to their homes during the night hours, while street children are those who live on the streets of one particular area. These are predominantly those who live without family members," Bhat said. Quoting a study which his organization conducted in Ahmedabad city in 20026-2007, he said that it was observed that on average, five children arrive in the city on a daily basis, mainly by train.

Gujarat Technological University gets A+ grade from NAAC

AHMEDABAD: The Gujarat Technological University (GTU) that applied for the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) after a decade of its establishment, received A+ grade accreditation on Tuesday.

GTU was inspected by a team from NAAC from February 9 to 11. The application for NAAC recognition can be made only after the first batch of

postgraduate students pass out from a university. GTU started its PG course in 2017 and the first batch passed out this year, so in November the university had applied for the recognition. Pankaj Patel, the in charge vice-chancellor of the university, said NAAC accreditation certifies the university's state of the art educational facilities and it is a moment of pride for the university.


Bank of India Officers Conduct, Discipline and Appeal Regulations was adopted in the Board in 1976.

coordinator at IIM Ahmedabad (IIMA), has albinism and 40 per cent vision. On the other hand, Sathish LM, an assistant


manager with IIMA, is five years younger than her. She is a native of Nainital while he belongs to Salem in Tamil Nadu. It was love that glued the uncommonness they shared. Kavya and Sathish waited 10 years before they finally tied the knot in October 2022. The couple wanted their families to be completely convinced of their decision and bless them wholeheartedly. "Being a person with albinism who must strain her eyes to see, I

was dealing with a lot of insecurity. I got along well with Sathish. We were both academic associates at the B-school. However, there was always this nagging question: Why would he do anything for a person like me?" recounts Kavya. "What touched me was that he was genuinely concerned about me. He would hold my hand while crossing the road and whisper the name of the person approaching us into my ear so that I did not strain my eyes

BKNMU in-charge VC is member of GU search panel



Ahmedabad: The syndicate members of Gujarat University on Tuesday selected Chetan Trivedi, the in charge vice chancellor of Bhakta Kavi Narsinh Mehta University in Junagadh, as the third member of the search committee that will shortlist potential candidates for the post of VC. The current GU VC Himanshu Pandya's term is expiring in June.

During the syndicate meeting held on Tuesday, the committee also approved the annual budget for 2023-24. The budget has a total layout of Rs 267.67 crore, which is lower than last year's budget of Rs 278 crore. Sources said

the GU syndicate and the academic council selected the third search committee member for the vice chancellor's post during the meeting. According to the rules, a search committee has to be constituted months before the term expires.

The three-member search committee includes one representative from the governor and one from the state government.

The third is appointed by the university's academic and education councils.

Apart from this, the syndicate also decided to set up a centre on campus where people could apply for a driving licence and get their Aadhaar cards issued. Sources said the existing computer lab would be used to get a learner's driving licence. The syndicate has also decided to upgrade the university mess and canteen to provide quality food to students. Sources said the syndicate did not discuss controversial topics like the allegations of irregularities in PhD degrees and the outsourcing of document verification and issuance work to a private agency without informing the syndicate.
